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

Apres Surf serves up food with heart and beers to match – just a short walk back from the beach, it's the perfect post-surf hangout (as the name suggests).



When you're not hanging out at the beach - we argue Mermaid's stretch of sand is one of the best on the Coast - be sure to pay a visit to some of the unique stores and boutiques in Mermaid Beach. Fashionistas will love Substance Boutique, while skaters will delight at the range on offer at **Precinct Skate** Shop. But one thing everyone will be able to agree on? A trip to **The Borrowed Nursery**. Set inside a former workshop, now transformed into a nurseryslash-party venue, Borrowed sells, rents and displays plants and pots, while also hosting workshops and events. It doesn't get more unique than that.

SUBURB SPOTLIGHT...

When visitors think of the Gold Coast, they no doubt picture Surfers Paradise. A towering skyline, golden bikiniclad Meter Maids and – of course – barrelling waves are all quintessential Surfers Paradise icons, but there's plenty

THE WEATHER IS HEATING UP AND SO ARE BARBEQUES UP AND DOWN THE GOLD COAST. YOU DON'T NEED A STATE-OF-THE-ART BARBIE TO GRILL, SMOKE AND SIZZLE UP A STORM – THERE ARE PLENTY OF GREAT BARBECUE SPOTS AROUND TOWN FOR YOU TO USE, FREE OF CHARGE.

JUSTIN'S PARK/ JOHN LAWS PARK, BURLEIGH

If it's a BBQ with a view you're after, look no further than Burleigh Heads. Both the beachfront Justin's Park and John Laws Park (known as Burleigh Hill to locals) offer clean, pristine barbecue facilities as well as beach access, toilets, nearby restaurants and – most famously – a stunning view of the Gold Coast.

KIRRA HILL LOOKOUT

Perched between North Kirra and Greenmount Beaches, the view from Kirra Hill Lookout is most certainly worth the trek up the hill. Sprawling views from Coolangatta right up to Surfers Paradise make this one of the best sunset spots on the Gold Coast, best enjoyed with a barbecued burger in hand.

LAGUNA PARK, PALM BEACH

This spot is a popular wedding destination and, after taking one look at the stunning waterfront location and towering palm trees, you'll understand why. This quiet slice of Palm Beach paradise is perfect for family get-togethers.

TALLEBUDGERA CREEK

WANTING TO KNOW WHAT WINES YOU SHOULD BE SLURPING IN THE HEAT? READ ON...

When it comes down to grabbing a bottle of wine for any occasion, we certainly have a plentiful choice here in the lucky country. You can go to lengths to find some top international drops but why would you when Australia is producing some really stellar wines that should certainly be on your radar this

Riesling is definitely one of these and is perfect drinking as the weather begins to warm up. Often mistaken as a purely sweet wine, there are some great examples of dry and fresh styles from the Clare and Eden Valleys in South Australia. These areas both have altitude and come summer usually have really warm days, yet relatively cool nights. Great conditions that bring on complexity and flavours within the grapes Thinking of a Marlborough Sauvignon Blanc? Trust me, do yourself a favour and dip your toe into this aromatic grape variety. In general, young Riesling is moderately citrus driven with apricot, nectarine and honey crisp apple aromas. Working fantastically with most spiced food.

2018 Reislingfreak no.4 – Eden Valley Riesling-Average \$22 a bottle.

Great freshness and acidity- flavours of bruised lime and sweet spice.

2017 Mountadam- Eden Valley Riesling-Average \$20 a bottle.

Aromas of citrus and blossom, underlying herb character make a great complex wine.

2017 O'Leary Walker- Polish Hill River Riesling-Average \$25 a bottle.

Bright and floral wine with a great lemon and lime crispness

WELLBEING...

STAY SUN SAFE THIS SUMMER

NOTHING RUINS SUMMER LIKE A
SUNBURN. WHILE THE PAIN AND
REDNESS MAY ONLY LAST A FEW DAYS,
A BAD SUNBURN CAN HAVE LONGTERM EFFECTS THAT WILL LEAVE
YOU WISHING YOU'D LATHERED UP
BETTER. TRY THESE TIPS FOR AVOIDING
HARMFUL SUN EXPOSURE THIS SUMMER.

While it's certainly true that you can get sunburnt all year 'round – especially when you're in the snow, thanks to its propensity for UV reflection – here in Queensland, we tend to spend a lot more time out in the sun during the summer months, meaning we seriously increase our chances of getting burned. That's why it's so important to keep those five sun safety secrets that the Cancer Council recommends – 'slip, slop, slap, seek and slide' – front of mind whenever we're exposed to the sun's rays.

SLIP...

on some clothing that protects your skin from the sun. Whether it's a sun shirt in the water or a long-sleeve top on the shore, making sure that your skin isn't exposed to the UV rays is a sure-fire way to prevent sunburn. Keep the fabric lightweight to stay nice and cool, too.

SLOP...

on a protective sunscreen that is SPF30 or higher. The Cancer Council recommends reapplying your sunscreen every two hours, particularly when you're sweating, swimming or towel drying, while also following their other sun safety tips.



SLAP...

on a hat – the broader the brim, the better! While you should generally try to stay out of the sun as much as possible, wearing a protective hat when you do have to spend time outdoors is a great way to protect not just your face and neck, but your scalp too (an easily forgotten area where melanomas are reportedly more lethal).

SEEK...

a shady spot if you're planning on spending the day outside! Whether it's under one of the enormous pine trees that are common on the southern end of the Gold Coast or your own beach umbrella, having a shady spot to relax in is a great way to reduce your risk of sunburn and overheating.

SLIDE...

on some sunnies, but make sure they meet Australian standards – the sunglasses must have, at minimum, good UV protection and protection against sun glare. Consult the Cancer Council website for a full description of the Australian Standard for protective eyewear before you make any purchases.

When in doubt, refer to the handy SunSmart app! It will tell you what the UV index – the ultraviolet radiation, said to be the invisible killer that you won't see or feel – is like for the day and how much sun protection you should use.



LIKE A BIRD

ON ANY GIVEN DAY, YOU'VE GOT YOUR FEET FIRMLY PLANTED ON THE GROUND. THESE HOLIDAYS, HOWEVER, MAKE LIKE A FEATHERED FRIEND AND SOAR HIGH ABOVE THE GROUND ON A WALKING ADVENTURE IN THE SKY...

There's something magical about Tamborine Mountain that draws my family time after time. When I get the kids to sit down at the start of every school holiday and write me their holiday wish list, a visit to Tamborine tops it most seasons. One of my family's favourite stops on any mountain adventure is Tamborine Rainforest Skywalk. This tourism gem's name is as literal as they get. Visitors follow the 1.5km Skywalk trail along the cool rainforest floor before enjoying a bird's eye view of the canopy of lush rainforest trees from a spectacular elevated walkway - it's as close to walking through the sky as you'll get! Think 300m of high-tech steel bridges through the highest points of the upper canopy as well as a 40m cantilever bridge that soars a breathtaking 30m above the creek and rainforest below.

Managed by brothers Nick and Brendan Moore, Skywalk was developed by the boys' very committed parents, lan and Jennifer, over a five-year period leading up to its opening in 2009. While the Moores previously owned and operated other well-known Tamborine Mountain businesses (including the innovative Songbirds in the Forest restaurant, sixstudio Sonabirds Rainforest Retreat and Glow Worm Eco-Tours), Skywalk has been their most difficult, yet rewarding, development. Nick describes his parents as "tenacious" in their approach.

"It took nearly five years of planning, research, obtaining state and local council approvals and overcoming various obstacles along the way," Nick explains. "Many problems had to be overcome in building a high steel bridge on steep, volcanic soils in the middle of a pristine rainforest without destroying the fragile environment. Most people would have given up."

Massive 120-tonne cranes with booms up to 80m long lifted the tower columns and 40m walkway and cantilever sections up, over and then carefully down through the canopy into place, high above the forest floor.

"We are proud to say that not one forest tree was cut down in the process of installing the Skywalk," Nick says.



While the Skywalk itself is the jewel in this eco adventure's crown, our family also loves the informative Rainforest Eco Gallery. It showcases local rainforest animals, birds and reptiles and includes dioramas of Australian and exotic insects, butterfly collections and a large aquarium with local water life. There are also interesting info panels sharing stories of local and indigenous Australian history. And when you've completed your Skywalk, nothing's better than a revitalising drink and some lunch in The Birdwing Café.

I'll admit, I had a few tummy butterflies the first time I ventured out on to the elevated section – it's high and the walkways are mesh-like so you can see through them to the amazing rainforest floor below. But once you catch your breath, you realise that Skywalk is actually equal parts exhilarating, awe-inspiring and educational. You'll go home wishing you were a bird who could call the Tamborine Mountain rainforest canopy your home.



SINGAPORE STOPOVER




Hitting the 'book now' button on return Scoot flights, heading straight out of Coolangatta into the city-state of Singapore, conjured incredible imagery in this exhausted, mother-of-three's mind. Four nights. Count 'em. Four. Of kid-free bliss. My eyes glazed over, my brain busy calculating how many hours of uninterrupted sleep that would equate to.

Mealtimes? Quiet. Me? Fixated on my Hainanese chicken rice, instead of tossing tablet devices to bored children like you'd toss a bone to a starving dog (I said BACK you beasts!).

But mostly I was looking forward to releasing all control and responsibility – with only myself to look after (instead of hovering over kids aged 7, 6 and 1) – what grown-up-type fun was I in for? Striking a sultry pose while sipping Slings at an infamous rooftop bar? Slipping into a summer dress to stroll through giant glass greenhouses or shopping up a storm in the city's answer to London's Oxford Street? These were all the mini movies playing in my mind by the time I ascended the steps to the Boeing 787 Dreamliner (an apt name given my trance-like state). Did they eventuate into reality? A big, fat, N. O. P. E.

It was clear by the end of my first day, Singapore had other things in mind for me (numerous Slings excluded). And I could not have loved it more. Kicking off the Sling series in the city's longest-running



microbrewery restaurant, Brewerkz in Clarke Quay, surfing Singapore's MRT system and finding myself at the iconic selfie spot of Marina Bay (with the national icon – a Merlion – backdrop of choice) – my 'quiet' afternoon turned into something else entirely.

Fortunate timing meant my visit coincided with the annual i Light art festival featuring light art installations that transformed the Marina Bay skyline, and made for some pretty faaaabulous Insta-stories fodder.

Said festival included a carnival. And when I say carnival, I mean of the size-of-threeand-a-half-football-fields variety. The Prudential Marina Bay Carnival was a popup festival of fun, with 40 rides and games brought in from all over the world. It would have been wrong for me not to have given it a good 'ol go. Did it need to be the rotating thrill ride called the Mach 5, which reaches 96km/h in under eight seconds, and had a G-force that made me feel as if my feet would drop away from my legs? Not really. But I'm not one to do things by halves. And after eight years of teacups and merry-gorounds, I figured I deserved titillation of the carnival kind.

And so started my spiral into all things adrenaline. Day two's planned sun soaking session on the man-made Sentosa Island instead saw me rise high above the South China Sea on the Skyride chairlift, smashing the competition in the Skyline Luge track and straddling a Segway for the very first time. No need to fret - I did still squeeze in a swim - and a Sling or two. Nighttime brought with it the water display, laser show, fire effects and spectacular music of 'Wings of Time' - the island's famous outdoor night show. BALTER BREWING COMPANY


